## ANOINTING of the SICK

Anointing of the sick is a **sacrament of healing.** It gives health and strength to the soul and even to the body, if it be God's will. It is given to Catholics who are seriously ill, or to people before surgery or in danger of dying. The most important purpose of this sacrament is to help prepare people for death and to help save their souls. If God desires it, this sacrament is used by God to actually heal the person. This sacrament takes away all of our venial sins, and it can be repeated if the person's condition gets worse. The sacrament can take place in a church, hospital or at home. It is important that members of the person's family and church are present to pray with and for them. The sacrament begins with the Prayer of the Faithful. This is followed by the laying on of hands on the head of the person who is sick by the priest. This gesture shows that the sick person is the focus of the prayer. It is a sign of the healing power of God and a silent calling of the Holy Spirit upon the person. It is the way Jesus healed many of those in his own community. Next, the priest anoints the forehead and hands of the person who is sick. The oil used is olive oil, blessed by the bishop at the Chrism Mass. The prayer said during the anointing asks God to help the person with his love and mercy and to save and raise up those who are sick. Finally the priest prays a special prayer over the person who is sick. The prayer expresses the church's hope for the person and trust that God will strengthen the person in their sickness.
