EUCHARIST

Did You Know!

The Eucharist has different names that emphasize different aspects of this sacrament. We call this sacrament Holy **Communion** because it unites us to Jesus. We call this sacrament *The weekly Envelope & monthly Building Fund totals needed the Breaking of the Bread because this is the way the first Christians described it. We call this sacrament the Eucharist because it is an action of thanksgiving to God and it increases our faith. We call this sacrament the **Last Supper** because of the meal that Jesus had with his twelve apostles the night before he died. We call this sacrament a **sacrifice** because Jesus offered himself and died on the cross for us. We call this sacrament the Real **Presence** because Jesus is fully present in his body, blood, soul and divinity (under appearances of bread and wine) even though we cannot see him. We call this sacrament the Mass because it ends by sending us forth so we may carry out God's will. Eucharist comes from the Greek word that means thanksgiving. The Eucharist is the perfect prayer and the source and high point of our Christian life.

Holy Communion: (1) The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ received during the Eucharistic celebration; (2) Reception of Jesus truly present under the forms of bread and wine. In Communion, we are united with Jesus and with one another and we become more like Jesus. Any baptized Catholic who is free from mortal sin and has fasted an hour from food and drink (water and medicine are permitted any time) may receive Communion. ~ Georgi Whelan
