From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends:

The number of promises I have made to God ever since I became a Christian are many: some private, others public; some simple, others solemn. What happened to those promises? I must humbly acknowledge that on some of them I have been just standing, on some others sitting. I feel that a few of those promises could have been as well written on wind and on running water. A commitment to God must be at least as binding as those we make at the bank. When Joshua asked all the tribes of Israel, "Decide today whom you will serve", the people in one voice answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the Lord". When we were baptized and became God's children, we entered into a covenant with God, and not into an oral contract which is not worth the paper it is written on. If we say we are committed to God as children to a father, how faithful are we in observing at least his Ten Laws, to which the Catechism of the Catholic Church devotes nearly 100 pages, more than one fifth of its length? Sometimes it is sad to think that the law of gravitation seems to be the only law that everybody observes.

Commitment to God our Father naturally calls for a commitment to his Son, Jesus Christ. We are not to consider ourselves Christians simply because we think we are. It is our faithfulness to Christ, especially when we are pushed to the wall or when we are ready to quit, that makes our commitment to Christ truly a covenant. The disciples of Jesus were severely challenged when Jesus said, "I am the bread of life." One group found Jesus' words too hard to take, left him and no more walked with him. But the disciples met the challenge successfully and remained faithful to him. When asked, "Would you also like to leave?" St. Peter on behalf of all said, "Lord, to whom would we go? You have the words of eternal life". How committed are we to Jesus when his teaching appears to be too idealistic to be practiced and too risky to be put into action? At those moments when our faith is challenged, or when some storm threatens to destroy us, we must not fix our attention on the problem but on the person of Jesus Christ, because he has promised, and that is his commitment to us, that he will not allow us to sink. Do we have faith to believe it, hope to anticipate it, and patience to await it?
