Inside the Church – the ALTAR

Walk into any Catholic Church and you will notice that the focal point of the church is the altar. The altar is a large table, usually made of stone or wood where the sacrifice of the Mass is offered. In the old covenant, animals were sacrificed on an altar. But in the New Covenant, the sacrifice of Christ is made present at every Mass on the altar.

In the early days of the Christian Church, altars were built over the final resting places of martyrs and saints, including perhaps the most famous of all - St. Peter's Basilica in Rome (the burial site of St. Peter). As the Church grew, this practice became all but impossible. But the connection with heroes of the faith and the altar continues. In the Latin rite, every fixed altar contains a **relic** (something physically connected with the martyr or saint – often a bone fragment or personal object). The relic is contained within the altar and dedicated by a bishop.

The altar is more than just a table. It is the table of the Lord!
