Here are some MARDI GRAS facts: Eat, drink and be merry because Mardi Gras is the last day before Lent! The day before Ash Wednesday is a day of celebration throughout the Catholic world. The name Mardi Gras, **Fat Tuesday**, may have arisen because the French used to drive a fat ox through the streets of Paris on this day. Or it may refer to the fact it is the day before the strict fast of Lent begins and all the "fat" foods like meat, eggs, cheese and butter had to be consumed before they went to waste.

Green, Gold and Purple are the colors of the holiday, so use them liberally. Purple represents justice; green stands for faith; and gold signifies power.

Bake a King Cake. A tiny plastic baby representing the Christ Child is baked inside a specially made cake. The person who finds it will have good luck next year - and they have to provide next year's king cake as well. The cake is usually decorated with sugar that has been colored with purple, green and gold food coloring.

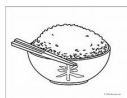
